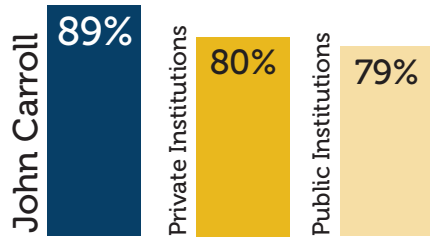

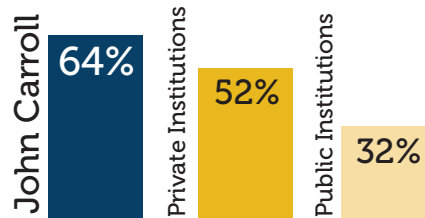
Fall 2013 enrollment

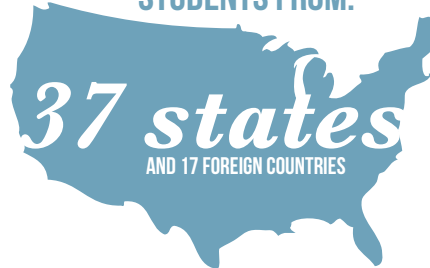

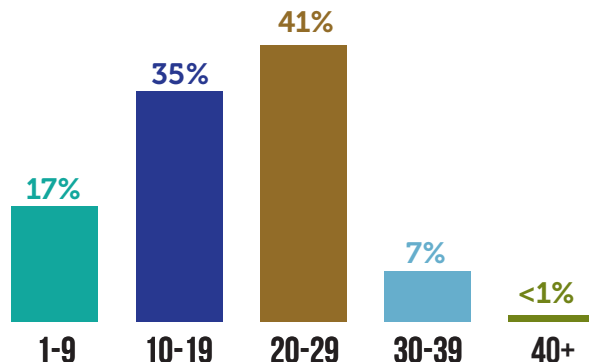

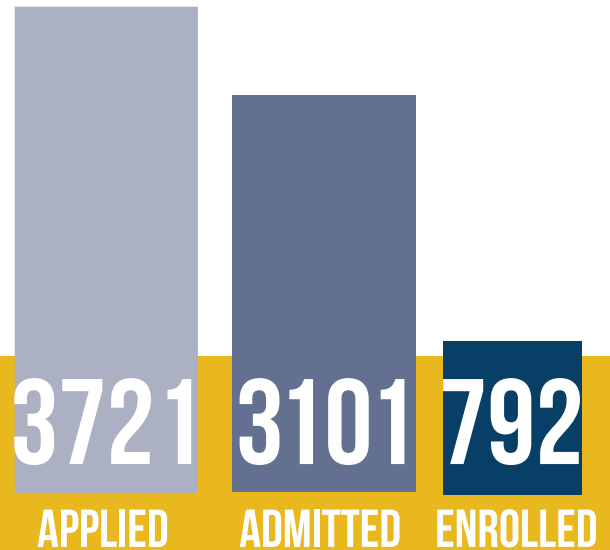

APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1) Submit The Common Application (with essay) at www.commonapp.org. JCU is a Common Application exclusive user and only accepts The Common Application.
- 2) Have your high school send us your official documents:
 - Transcript
 - Common Application School Report
 - Teacher evaluation/recommendation (optional)
- 3) Request from the College Board and/or ACT to have your standardized test scores sent to us electronically (if not on your HS transcript):
 - College Board (SAT): JCU's school code is **1342**
 - ACT: JCU's school code is **3282**
