## GENERAL TRANSFER GUIDE FOR CUYAHOGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE

John Carroll University welcomes inquiries from students at Cuyahoga Community College who wish to obtain a bachelor's degree. This guide has been designed to assist the student to choose courses which will meet current core requirements at John Carroll. The Core requirements consist of specific courses in five divisions. You may choose to take these classes at Cuyahoga Community College or John Carroll after you have transferred. Only specific courses meet CORE requirements at John Carroll: their Cuyahoga Community College equivalents are listed below.

Students accepted at John Carroll University will receive official transcript evaluations after having been admitted. The credit evaluation will include a list of courses and credits which are transferable. Students should note that John Carroll uses a semester credit system.

***These University core requirements are good through the summer 2015 semester. A new core curriculum will go into effect beginning the fall 2015 semester for incoming first year students. There is a limit of 64 semester hours (96 quarter hours) that may be transferred from a community college.***

#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS:

1. Writing intensive course beyond English composition. This course is usually taken in a student's major during the junior or senior year.
2. Two international courses; one of which must study one or more societies of Asia, Africa or Latin America. For more information, please consult with a John Carroll transfer student counselor.
3. One course which focuses on issues of diversity (indigenous populations, racism, sexism). For more information, please consult with a John Carroll transfer student counselor.

\*Non-lab credit.

\*\* The philosophy requirements at John Carroll are very specific. Three courses are required: Introduction to Philosophy, a philosophy class which is historical in context, and the third course which is one of specialization. It is suggested that students take only Phil 1010 to satisfy philosophy requirements since no historical philosophy classes are offered at CCC.

Students planning to transfer to the John Carroll University School of Business should be particularly careful in their choice of classes. **The only business courses which will satisfy business core or major requirements at John Carroll are accounting and economics.** Other business courses will be accepted as elective credit only and are not needed to fulfill degree requirements.
