- This plan assumes that students transferring from Lakeland will either: 1) apply for the Teacher Education program prior to beginning their first term at JCU, or 2) apply during their first term at JCU and be exempted from our rule that students must be accepted into the program before taking ED 225 and ED 355. (This rule doesn't apply for ED 100 or 253.)
- In the approved transfer policy, it states that transfer students with 45+ credits must take "Two courses (6 credits) from the Jesuit Heritage component of the core curriculum". ED 350 (as well as ED 253) is currently designated as ISJ course. This plan assumes that ED 350, as ISJ course, will count toward the 2 Jesuit Heritage courses required.
