The *Speech Communication* requirement is normally satisfied by completion of CO 100. A competence examination is available through the Department of Communication and Theatre Arts for those who have completed at least one year of high school speech. The *Foreign Language* requirement is satisfied by two courses in the same language at the level of placement.

and one additional course.

***Two courses from two disciplines.

****Three courses involving a minimum of 10 credits: one in Mathematics (MT); one, with laboratory, in Biology (BL), Chemistry (CH), or Physics (PH); and one additional course.
