FROM THE DIRECTOR

This fall, the Arrupe Scholars Program welcomed 22 new students to John Carroll University. The class of 2018 comes to us from places both near (Broadview Heights, Ohio) and far (Giza, Egypt). They have begun their academic studies

at JCU by taking two social justice oriented courses as a cohort. This semester, Donald Modica is teaching our Arrupe Scholars section of Composition and Rhetoric (EN 111). In this class, Arrupe Scholars practice college-level writing while thinking about social justice issues. Additionally, our students are enrolled in a 1-credit Introduction to Social Action course (AR 150A) with Lisa Brown Cornelius and Michelle Millet. AR 150A introduces students to the writings of Pedro Arrupe, hones their understanding of advocacy, and helps them to process the service work they are doing in our local community. Members of the class of 2018 have chosen to give their time and energy to a wide variety of community partners. They are tutoring Cleveland elementary school students, mentoring local teens, providing citizenship test prep for recent refugees, assisting persons with special needs, and socializing with residents at local nursing homes. Needless to say, members of the Arrupe Scholars class of 2018 are learning a great deal from both their academic studies and their work in the community.
