This scholarship is intended for students who are not yet qualified to sit for the CPA exam. Those who are CPAs or who are qualified to sit for the CPA exam prior to beginning the master's program should not apply since they are not considered to be eligible.

There are three distinct scholarship awards for which a student is eligible. The first, known as the base scholarship, will be in the amount of approximately \$2,500 - \$3,500 and will be awarded to every eligible individual. Two additional awards of up to (approximately) \$3,000 *each* will be made based on academic merit. One of these will be made to all students who score a 580 or higher on the GMAT. The other merit award will be made based on the student's GPA in undergraduate major accounting classes (excluding principles). A minimum GPA of 3.0 in Accounting courses is required for this third scholarship. Each of these will be on a sliding scale. The better the GMAT score or GPA, the higher the award.

Students will be automatically eligible for the base award and the GMAT score award. In order to be considered for the GPA award, the student must submit (to the Chair of the Accountancy Department) an official copy of his or her final undergraduate transcript which lists all accounting courses taken and the grade earned.

Base scholarship monies are awarded when the applicant is enrolled in the first John Carroll Accounting course (at the 550 level or higher). **THE STUDENT IS REQUIRED TO NOTIFY THE CHAIR OF THE ACCOUNTANCY DEPARTMENT WHEN THAT OCCURS.** Other scholarships are applied as tuition credits shortly after the awards are determined.

OVER FOR ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The individual class award is granted once. If a student withdraws from the course once it has begun, the entire scholarship is forfeited, regardless of the refund policy of John Carroll University.

For consideration for the base scholarship award, this application is due on March 15th for summer admissions, July 15th for fall admissions and November 15th for spring admissions. Please return it to the chairperson of the Accountancy department.

For consideration for an academic merit award, official final undergraduate transcripts must be submitted to the Accountancy Department Chairperson no later than sixty days after beginning the master's program at John Carroll. In the case of students who are taking master's level courses while still an undergraduate, the final transcript must be submitted no later than sixty days after completing his or her undergraduate degree.
