Example of a Typical 4-year Progression through the International Business with Language and Culture (IBLC) Major

This program requires 129 hours to graduate. This includes 57 hours of university core, 12 additional hours of language (through 2 semesters of 300-level language courses), 39 hours of business core, and 21 hours of IB major requirements. Students who come in at the intermediate or higher level of language, who are able to test out of one or more computer classes, or who come in with AP credits in university core may, of course, have fewer specific course requirements but will still need to be sure that all requirements for graduation are met. The block schedule describes a typical 4 year progression through the IBLC major assuming no language or other credits or waivers.
