Course Description/ Objectives:

This course is designed to provide an understanding of the purpose and use of accounting information for business decisions through the study of generally accepted accounting principles as applied to financial statements. Throughout the course, we will focus on the basic financial statements- their composition and what they mean. Additionally, we will investigate some of the current issues and controversies in financial accounting effecting business today. As a summer course, all course material must be completed in 7 weeks.
