

Career Education Courses

Our courses will help you answer these questions...

Who am I and what am I passionate about?

CE-111: Exploring Your Options

- Freshmen and Sophomores last 7 weeks of the semester
- Students that are undecided on a major and/or career field will explore their interests, values, personality and skills in relation to academic options available to them

CE-101: Introduction to Careers

- Freshmen and Sophomores
- Examination of self in relation to the world of work in terms of values, skills, and interests
- Exploration of occupational paths for all majors, examination of employer-employee expectations
- Introduction to job search strategies, preparation of resumes, development of interviewing skills

Where am I needed in the world?

CE-121: Introduction to the Accounting Profession

- Sophomores and Juniors with the intention of majoring in Accountancy
- Introduction to the opportunities available in the accounting profession and the requirements of the accountancy major
- Preparation for the junior-year internship

CE-122: Introduction to the Careers in Psychology

- Students who are majoring in or are interested in pursuing careers in Psychology last 7 weeks of the semester
- Explores the variety of career opportunities available in the field of Psychology.

How Do I Get There?

CE-131: Introduction to the World of Work

- Juniors and Seniors only
- Prepare for the transition from college to career after graduation
- Learn effective job search strategies, how to negotiate job offers, how to get experience before graduation, and financial planning for the new graduate
- Students will evaluate their marketable skills and experience, conduct research on a career field, interview a professional in their chosen field and participate in a mock interview or career advising session

CE-199, 102, 103, 104: Academic Internship

- Sophomores with minimum 2.2 GPA
- Students of all majors are eligible to enroll for 0-3 credit hours for their internship experience*
- Designed to promote individual career development and self-awareness by integrating classroom learning with practical work experience

*Each course is one credit hour. A maximum of 4 CE credits will count toward graduation hours. You cannot take a course more than once. Please refer to your course bulletin for information on prerequisites for all Career Education courses.
