

2005 ANNUAL SECURITY REPORT

John Carroll University strives to provide a campus that is safe and secure for its students, faculty and staff. All members of the university community are encouraged to take responsibility for and assist in the protection of their safety and the safety of others.

REPORTING CRIMINAL ACTIONS AND OTHER EMERGENCIES

Criminal activity of other emergencies are to be reported to CSS at 397-4600. Reported occurrences are investigated by CSS and, as needed, the assistance of local, state, or other law enforcement agencies is sought. All criminal matters should be reported to CSS even if additional reports are made to residence hall assistants or other personnel. If the student or employee so desires, university personnel may assist in notifying law enforcement authorities. The 9-1-1 emergency number will connect you with University Heights dispatchers. (Off-campus telephone numbers are accessed by first dialing "9" for an outside line.)

SEXUAL ASSAULT AND RAPE PREVENTION

It is the responsibility of each member of the university community to prevent sexual assault. The university offers instructional programs for all students on sexual assault and rape prevention during the first weeks of the fall semester. Residence hall students are encouraged to attend special floor meetings where the issues of rape and sexual assault are discussed. A complete schedule of programs can be obtained from the Student Life Office, or by calling 397-4408.

If you are the survivor of a sexual assault, the following steps are recommended: go to a safe place where you feel comfortable; your first desire may be to wash yourself, don't. Do not shower, change your clothes or move anything until you have made some important decisions.

The university also encourages prompt reporting to CSS and local law enforcement authorities. Upon request, university personnel will assist you in notifying Campus Safety Services and the police. When you go to the hospital, you should be treated for injuries, sexually transmitted diseases, etc. Take a change of clothes since your clothes may be needed as evidence.

As the survivor of a rape or sexual assault you have the right to be treated with respect, dignity and without prejudice; to be made aware of and receive medical, social and counseling services; and to have access to all legal and medical options available.

The university will cooperate in altering housing accommodations or course schedule of an assault survivor, upon request when alternatives are reasonably available.

Students found responsible for sexual offenses will be disciplined, up to and including suspension or expulsion from the university. During university disciplinary proceedings on sexual offenses, both the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have other present during the hearing. In addition, both the accuser and the will be notified of the final outcome of the disciplinary proceeding.

CAMPUS SEX CRIME PREVENTION ACT

Passed in 2000, the Campus Sex Crime Prevention Act requires that certain convicted sex-offenders must identify themselves to colleges and universities if they; a) attend classes, b) work on a college or university campus, or c) volunteer on a college or university campus.

Colleges and universities are required as of October 1, 2003 to make members of their communities aware of where sex-offender information can be obtained.

In the State of Ohio, sex-offender registries are maintained by each of the 88 county sheriff's offices. In Cuyahoga County information on registered sex-offenders can be obtained by:

CAMPUS LAW ENFORCEMENT

JCU Campus Safety Services (CSS) is a campus police department under Section 1713.50 of the Ohio Revised Code. All officers have arrest powers. CSS is available 24-hours per day, seven days per week; the Belvoir Gate House is always attended. Crimes occurring on campus are reported to the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Uniform Crime Reports through the University Heights Police Department. When serious crimes occur that pose a danger to the campus community, notice is conveyed to all segments of the community.

CRIME PREVENTION

Each student is responsible for knowing and abiding by the regulations and policies set forth in the Community Standards Manual. Sanctions for student misconduct may include suspension or expulsion from the university in addition to state or federal prosecution or civil liability. Students are expected to cooperate with residence hall assistants in maintaining safe and secure residence halls. Exterior doors or residence halls are locked at all times. Non-residents are not permitted in residence halls without a resident escort. Each residence hall lobby has a courtesy telephone for this purpose. Residents are responsible for the behavior of their guests.

Classroom, library, and recreational facility hours are posted each semester. Employees working after normal hours or on weekends should notify CSS of their location and approximate time they will be in the building. Any person may request a campus escort by calling CSS at 397-4600 (this service is available 24-hours per day).

Courtesy telephones are located in the lobbies or corridors of buildings. Assistance from CSS can be summoned from these locations. Students and employees are encouraged to become aware of their locations.

These are campus telephones only: University Heights Police or Fire Departments cannot be reached from these telephones.

No solicitation is permitted on campus. If salespeople, agents or peddlers are canvassing residence halls, academic facilities or offices, notify CSS.

Plant Services routinely surveys the campus to maintain safety through proper lighting and maintenance or grounds and buildings. You may report a potential safety hazard to Plant Services at 397-4314 or CSS at 397-4600.

CRIME STATISTICS

Crime is reported (see Statistical Report) under the following categories:

ON CAMPUS - any building or property owned or controlled by an institution of higher education within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution and used by the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls; a) property within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution that is owned by the institution but is controlled by other persons, b) is frequently used by students and c) supports institutional purposes (such as food/ retail vendor).

RESIDENCE HALLS - is a subset of 'on-campus' crimes, which includes only those crimes that were reported to have occurred in residence halls or other residential facilities on campus.

NON-CAMPUS BUILDINGS - any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization officially recognized by the institution and any building or property (other than a branch campus) owned or controlled by an institution of higher education that; a) is used in direct support of, or in relation to, the institution's educational purposes, b) is frequently used by students, and c) is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution.

PUBLIC PROPERTY - all public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, and is within the campus, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus.
