Since this resume will be sent to the cooperating teacher(s) and administrator(s) at your assigned Pre-student Teaching site, **it is imperative** that your resume be correct, informative and without errors.

Template for a One-Page PST Resume

Heading: At top, centered. Include your full name, mailing address, e-mail address, one phone number (likely cell phone).

Individual sections:

Education

List in reverse chronological order.

Start with high school (for now, probably not when job hunting).

Include name and location of school, date of graduation

List all colleges/universities attended

Degree/major

Date (or expected date) of graduation

May include study abroad.

May list GPA

Honors

Include this section only if you have things such as honor societies, Honors Program, awards, scholarships received.

Teaching-related Experience

May use sub-categories such as course-related field experiences, volunteer or community service, employment.

List in reverse chronological order (within sub-categories, if you organize it that way). For each listing name the place where the experience occurred, the dates, and a very brief description of what you did for each experience (such as observations, assisting the teacher, tutoring, etc.)

Other Experience/Activities

May use subcategories such as extracurricular activities, volunteer or community service work, employment.

List in reverse chronological order (within sub-categories, if you organize it that way). For each listing name the place where the experience occurred, the dates, and a very brief description of what you did for each experience/activity. If you had a leadership role, such as an elected office or team captain, be sure to include that information.

Skills/Interests

Optional to include this heading. Consider if items have potential appeal to a school or school district.
