DESCRIPTION AND GUIDELINES FOR
SALLY H. WERTHEIM EDUCATIONAL
LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship recognizes an outstanding graduate student who not only demonstrates leadership, scholarship, character, and commitment to others—qualities steeped in the Jesuit mission—but who also seeks to enhance, and shows promise for improving, the educational experiences of children and youth. Candidates for the award must be a currently active student in a Master in Education program at John Carroll University.

The Sally H. Wertheim Educational Leadership Scholarship celebrates Dr. Wertheim's service and leadership to the John Carroll Community. During her decades of dedicated service to the university, Dr. Wertheim, Professor, and Dean Emeritus, also served as Academic Vice President during an interim period, chaired the Department of Education and Allied Studies for nine years and served as Dean of the Graduate School for 13 years. She taught in the areas of Foundations and Multicultural Education and until recently she taught in the Non-Profit Administration graduate program. Her leadership extends beyond JCU into the surrounding community, where she continues to serve on several boards in Greater Cleveland and statewide. Dr. Wertheim received her Ph.D. in the history of education from Case Western Reserve University.

Requirements for the award include an application, an official undergraduate transcript with a minimum grade point average of 3.0, two letters of recommendation that describe academic and professional accomplishments and community service, and a 500 word essay that demonstrates how the applicant has made a difference and continues to make a difference in the educational experiences of children and youth.

The application process occurs in the fall semester. Applications are reviewed by a committee that includes the Associate Dean, Social Sciences, Education, Global Studies in the College of Arts and Sciences, a Wertheim family member, the chair of the Education and School Psychology Department, and a department faculty member appointed by the chair. The deadline for applications and supporting documentation is **Monday, November 16, 2015**. Finalists participate in a personal interview. The award is announced in the fall semester and is presented at the Department's Awards Program and Reception in May. The scholarship must be used only for tuition (full- or part- time) and must be used within a five-year period.

The scholarship amount will be up to \$5,000 annually for tuition only. In future years more than one award may be made possible through gifts made by friends, alumni, and others inclined to support educational service and leadership.
