Faculty Spotlight: Dr. Elizabeth Stiles, Nonprofit Administration



"I appreciate the personal touch here at John Carroll and the helpfulness of my colleagues and the staff." Dr. Elizabeth Stiles began working at John Carroll University in 2001 as an assistant professor in political science. Currently, Dr. Stiles is the director of the Nonprofit Administration Program as well as an associate professor of Political Science. Dr. Stiles research interests include social movements; institutional interaction on the state level; lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, questioning (LGBTQ) movement; and state elections.

Dr. Stiles stated that she "enjoys the best of John Carroll, which is hands-down the people. Some of the best people I have ever met have been here." Dr. Stiles' went on further to say, "I appreciate the personal touch here at John Carroll and the

Transient Petition Form: New Information

The university has created an online version of the Transient Petition, which undergraduate and graduate students use to get permission to take courses at other universities. We will be transitioning away from the paper petitions and to the online version, which is now available to students on the website at http://www.jcu.edu/A&S/forms/transient/transientpetition.asp

A grade of B (not B-) or better is required for transfer of courses. In such cases, only the credits are transferred; the grades received do not affect the student's GPA at John Carroll. Graduate students may NOT obtain credit from a two-year institution. The maximum allowance for transfer will be the equivalence in semester hours of two comparable courses at John Carroll. Courses used to complete requirements for other degrees will not be accepted for transfer. Official transcripts must be sent from the institution to the Graduate Studies Office of College of Arts and Sciences.

She has also had several publications in both professional publications and newsletters. Dr. Stiles is an Assistant Editor for the Journal of Economics and Politics, and was Vice-President and President of the Ohio Association of Economists and Political Scientists (OAEPS).

In addition to her teaching and scholarship, Dr. Stiles is actively involved in service activities. She is currently the director of Allies and the Campus Democrats. She was also the Sailing Club Advisor for several years. Dr. Stiles has gone on a Cleveland Immersion trip which she stated "was amazing and eye-opening." She is currently serving on the Advising Committee of the Academic Planning Task Force. In addition, Dr. Stiles is the Internship Director for the Political Science Department. She has taught FYS for four years, was on the Poverty and Solidarity Learning Committee, and a member of the Social Entrepreneurship Learning Community and the Harlem Renaissance Learning Community. Dr. Stiles has also moderated a couple of debates including the University Heights' Mayoral Race and the County Executive's Race. Most recently, she assisted in teaching the brandnew Queer Studies Course.

Consultants are available in our O'Malley Center location (OC207) Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m., and on Friday from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. We also have After-Hours sessions in Seminar A, on the Garden Level of Grasselli Library, on Sunday and Wednesday evenings from 7:00 p.m.-9:30 p.m. (walk-in basis only). 2011-12 Tuition Increase

Graduate tuition will increase to \$685 a credit hour in the College of Arts and Sciences; \$845 per credit hour in the Boler School of Business for the 2011-2012 academic year (beginning with the fall semester). This change represents a 1.48% increase in the College of Arts and Sciences.

If you are planning on taking summer classes in 2011, your tuition cost will fall under the 2010-2011 rates of \$675 a credit hour in the College of Arts and Sciences; \$830 per credit hour in the Boler School of Business.
