
Learning More About: The Graduate Student Association

The Graduate Student Association (GSA) is an organization which sponsors interdepartmental social events as a way for all graduate students to enhance their John Carroll graduate experience. Also, the GSA enhances student development through various programs as they relate to the development of women and men of diverse religious, economic and cultural backgrounds with the knowledge and character to lead and to serve.

The GSA has been at John Carroll University for three years. Last year, in an effort to enhance graduate student life on campus, the Graduate Student Association sent out a survey to examine the types of events that would bring graduate students together. A number of interesting results emerged from the survey including: 46% indicated interest in a graduate student retreat; 57% would participate in a service project; over 400 students indicated an interest in **networking** with faculty, alumni, and fellow graduate students; Professional workshops were of interest to 50%; and 52% were interested in a department-specific speaker series.

As a direct response to these results, the GSA restructured its leadership board from three

the University, and most recently served as Co-Chair of the Academic Planning Task Force.

In 2008, Prof. Colleran received the Curtis W. Miles Award for Community Service. The Community Service Award honored Dr. Colleran's involvement with the Famicos Foundation, a low-income housing organization in Hough neighborhood of Cleveland. Both Dr. Colleran and her husband, JCU alumni Richard Weaver, have volunteered at the Famicos Foundation for 30 years. Most recently, she coordinated a summer camp for children in Park Village, one of the complexes at the Famicos Foundation. Dr. Colleran plans to continue to organize quarterly community events for Park Village, working with two friends outside JCU.

Dr. Colleran also won the 2004 Distinguished Faculty Award, as well as the Northeast Ohio Council of Higher Education Award for

Teaching Excellence. She received the 1995 Culicchia Award for Teaching Excellence, College of Arts and Sciences.

Originally from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Dr. Colleran attended John Carroll University for her undergraduate degree, Case Western Reserve University for her masters and Ohio State University for her doctorate degree; all in English.

Dr. Colleran stated that "the best part of my new position is all of the wonderful colleagues in the Dean's offices and the great faculty in the College of Arts and Sciences."

As her father is a well-known Bluegrass musician, when she's not working at John Carroll, Dr. Colleran enjoys listening to both classical and bluegrass music. She also enjoys playing the guitar and watching films and theatre with her husband and two children, James and Julia.
