A rich aspect of the Jesuit tradition is to inaugurate each academic year with a "Mass of the Holy Spirit," an occasion for convening the community for the purpose of a shared, spiritual celebration of the challenging semesters ahead. This celebration takes place on all Jesuit high school, college and university campuses across the United States, as well as at numerous other Catholic and Jesuit educational institutions worldwide. While the John Carroll community represents many faith traditions, this celebration unites us in one communal quest for the gift of wisdom and compassion for our faculty, staff and students. There are times when various life circumstances arise and we have to change our plans in midstream. If you find that you need to withdraw from <u>all</u> of your classes, either for one semester or permantly, there is a complete withdrawal process that we must follow. The first step is to inform me of your decision to withdraw. We will schedule a time for a face-to-face meeting or a phone conversation to complete a withdrawal form.
