Thesis/Essay Deadline for WINTER Graduation

If your program requires the submission of a thesis or essay, the deadline for submitting your final draft to the Office of Graduate Studies is **November 17, 2014.** When submitting your thesis/essay/creative project to the Office of Graduate Studies it is recommended that you wait to print your work on the required paper until after you have received approval from your advisor and dean. You may submit it on regular paper along with the appropriate signatures.
