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Building Collaborative Leadership

Professional Learning Communities

IER will plan and facilitate regular meetings for district principals, teachers or staff that will focus on collaboration in a learning community.

- Principals from across the district will meet to identify common district-wide needs, share solutions and work toward a shared vision.
- Teachers will work at or across grade level and department teams with a focus on analyzing data, examining student work and building their collaboration skills.
- Paraprofessionals, aides or other staff members will meet to examine best practices for working in the school community.

Follow up at the school level includes resources and on-site coaching and modeling for principals, teachers or staff members as they implement action steps planned at meetings.

Developing Group Leadership Skills

IER staff will provide monthly professional development for team leaders and lead teachers at the district or school level.

- Team leaders will develop group facilitation and leadership skills.
- Lead teachers will develop content area understanding as well as group facilitation and leadership skills.



Follow up at the school level will include resources and on-site coaching and modeling for teachers as they implement new skills learned through their training.

Supporting Effective Teaching and Learning

Study Groups Across the District

IER consultants will facilitate a study group for teachers and/or staff members on-site at each district school. Possible topics for the group include:

- Word Study
- Fluency in Reading and Writing
- Reading in the Content Area
- Literature Circles
- Independent Reading
- Guided Reading
- Writing Workshop

An independent evaluation of IER programming found a significant relationship between teacher participation in IER study groups and effective teaching and learning practices, as defined by the Great Schools Framework.

Follow up at the school level will include classroom modeling and coaching for group members as they implement strategies and skills learned through group study.

IER/JCU Graduate Courses

IER consultants will teach one or a series of graduate level courses on-site in the district. Courses are one to two credit hours and can be offered for CEUs or graduate credit through John Carroll University.

- I: Comprehensive Literacy in a Developmentally and Culturally Responsive Environment (2 cr.)
- II: Building Community to Support Academic Success (2 cr.)
- III: Developing a Culture of Collaboration within the School Community (2 cr.)

IV: The Young Adolescent Learner (1 cr.)

Developing Positive School Cultures

Positive School Culture Teams

IER consultants will provide professional development for teams from each school to examine the current culture of their respective buildings and to support the development of positive cultures across the district.



Follow up at the school level will include on-site coaching and support for teams as they implement concepts learned in session at their respective schools.
