- 2. Have you had any **peer leadership** experience? If so, what have you learned from these experiences? If not, what do you anticipate being your greatest opportunity AND challenge in this role of peer leadership?
- 3. Please rank (from highest to lowest) the following areas in terms of your strengths; provide brief comments/descriptions on some (or all) qualities, as necessary: adaptability, assertiveness, communication, community-building, creativity, educating others, initiative, knowledge of/passion for justice, organization, reflectiveness.
- 4. What do you think are the important features of a thorough immersion preparation process? How would you facilitate this process and what unique ideas do you have?
- 5. One of the greatest challenges of the immersion experience program is getting students to stay engaged with their group after they return. What are your ideas for helping students to continue their commitment to what they have experienced after the trip is over?
- 6. What do you think is the key "thing" (outcome, goal, etc.) the immersion program achieves?
