The Nonprofit Leader of Tomorrow Award

We are pleased to announce that NPA Student **Rachel Zaccardelli** has been granted the Nonprofit Leader of Tomorrow award. She is the first student to receive this award from the Nonprofit Administration Program.

During her time in the program, Rachel demonstrated academic excellence, leadership, and service to the community, the core values of a Nonprofit Leader of Tomorrow. While maintaining a 3.8 GPA, Rachel worked as a graduate assistant in the John Carroll Career Center where one of her tasks was to increase the number of appointments among undergraduate students. Rachel successfully achieved a 20% increase in annual sophomore appointments. In the summer of 2012, Rachel was selected from among 200 candidates to participate in the 2012 Cleveland Foundation Summer Internship Program. It was through this opportunity that Rachel was able to put her classroom knowledge into practice.

"Now, two years later, I can say that applying to the program was the best decision I've made. Through my experiences in the Nonprofit Administration program at John Carroll University, I have been able to develop into the young professional that I am today. The past two years of coursework has taught me very valuable information that I have already been able to implement into my work."

Rachel will be graduating from the program in May, and plans to begin working full-time as a communications assistant with Partnership for a Safer Cleveland, a nonprofit organization devoted to increasing safety and providing developmental opportunities for young people and communities.

Scholarship Information

Lavelle Internships

Lavelle Internships in Nonprofit Organizations are funded through the Robert M. Ginn Institute for Corporate Social Responsibility and provide funding for students to complete an administrative or managerial internship at a local, private, non-profit organization. Only unpaid internships are eligible for funding through this program and must involve at least 135 work hours during the funded semester. Internships can be completed for academic credit at the discretion of the student either through a departmental internship requirement or through the Center for Career Service. The scholarship is awarded in the form of credit to offset tuition expenses.

The Belda Fund

The Belda Fund allows for reimbursement of up to \$500 per year in travel costs associated with doing an unpaid internship in NE Ohio. Internships must be registered for academic credit either through the Center for Career Services or through a qualifying Nonprofit Administration internship. Funding is not guaranteed and will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis. The reimbursement will be awarded at the end of the internship in the form of a personal check.

You may not receive the Belda and Lavelle scholarships at the same time.

Graduation Application Deadlines

Commencement 2013 will be on May 19th.

Graduate students who complete degree requirements and wish to participate in the May 2013 commencement exercise and have not yet applied to graduate must pay a late fee. In order to qualify for participation in commencement, students cannot have more than nine remaining hours necessary to complete their degree program.

The Summer 2013 graduation application deadline was Feb. 15th. Summer commencement will be on August 31st.

Students planning on graduating in Winter 2013 must complete a Graduation Application by July 8th. The application is located at http://sites.jcu.edu/graduatestudies/pages/current-students-2/graduation/degree-application/. Winter commencement will be on January 15, 2014.
