The Nursi Chair in Islamic Studies was established at John Carroll University in 2003 in order to promote the teachings and vision of Bediüzzaman Said Nursi (1876-1960), a scholar of Islam from Turkey who dedicated his entire life to the teachings of the Qur'an. A prolific writer, Nursi wrote over 100 books and treatises on Islamic subjects.

His magnum opus is the multi-volume work Risale-i Nur (The Treatises of Light'). The Nursi Chair Endowment supports courses on Islam taught within John Carroll's Theology & Religious Studies department and community events, including:

- · An annual week of Islamic art and culture.
- · An annual community Iftar Dinner during the holy month of Ramadan.
- Lecture series featuring internationallyrecognized speakers on topics of interest to Islamic Studies.
- Film and art events about Islam.
- Community interfaith dialogues.
- Support for Muslim student group activities.
