• INTRODUCTION OF TIM KESICKI, S.J.

- And now, I am very pleased to introduce our commencement speaker, Fr. Tim Kesicki.
- As a John Carroll alumnus, he is not only one of our own, but, as the former president of Saint Ignatius High School (2000-2008), he is a beloved member of the Greater Cleveland community.
- He also served on John Carroll's Board of Directors from 2000 to 2010.
- As one who has walked the paths at John Carroll as a student, board member, and Jesuit leader, Tim Kesicki undoubtedly has many stories to share from his Carroll years.
- Only a select few individuals can reflect on the John Carroll experience from such a unique blend of perspectives and speak to our graduating seniors about becoming leaders and people of character to shape a better society.

- Fr. Kesicki received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from John Carroll in 1984. That same year, he entered the Society of Jesus at Loyola House Jesuit Novitiate in Michigan. His formation as a Jesuit included philosophical studies at Loyola University Chicago, theological studies at Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, California, and studies in educational administration at Teachers College of Columbia University in New York.
- From 1988 to 1991, Fr. Kesicki worked at the University of Detroit Jesuit High School and Academy, where he taught theology, directed the service program, and served on the pastoral team.
- He was ordained to the priesthood in 1994. After his ordination, Fr. Kesicki worked for a year at the Jesuit Refugee Service in Uganda, and then taught theology at Loyola High School in Detroit, until 2000, when he moved to Saint Ignatius and served until his Provincial appointment in 2008.
