Re: Summer research opportunities at The Cleveland Clinic during Summer 2014

For more than a decade, researchers at The Cleveland Clinic have offered research opportunities to John Carroll University Psychology students. The Clinic has again agreed to host students during Summer 2014. This is an excellent opportunity for any student considering graduate school, and for students who have not yet made up their minds about a career direction.

We encourage students to apply to this program by submitting a completed application form (see attached) along with an unofficial transcript (generated on Banner) that includes courses and grades through the Fall 2013 semester and an indication of those in which you are currently enrolled. We expect that students will be paid a stipend of \$3000 for a 10 week commitment (40 hours/week) during the period from mid-May to late August (the exact pay will be determined before selection is completed. Students will be notified before being asked to commit to the program. The begin date will be determined by the student and his/her Clinic mentor). Applying for this program does not preclude students from applying to other summer research programs either here at JCU or elsewhere; it is simply one more option for a summer research opportunity.

Students will be selected for the program based on their academic record, relevant coursework, and the comments of two JCU science faculty members who can serve as references.

Dr. Christine Moravec of The Cleveland Clinic will set up interviews between students nominated for the program and interested Clinic researchers. Final selection decisions will be made by individual Clinic researchers, thus applicants are **not** guaranteed a position at The Clinic simply by being granted an interview.

Additionally:

- Participation in all interviews with Dr. Moravec is <u>mandatory</u>. Failure to attend any interview may result in students being removed from consideration.
- Students who are placed in the Clinic summer program are <u>required</u> to work for 10 consecutive weeks during the summer and may not be excused for athletic camps, family vacations, etc.
- In addition, students are <u>required</u> to present their research at the annual Celebration of Scholarship at JCU during the 2014-15 academic year, and are <u>required</u> to give a presentation for the Psychology Department's Student Scholars Luncheon at some point in the 2014 -2015 academic year.
- The Cleveland Clinic does not employ smokers and does conduct a urinalysis that detects if you have smoked in the last 30 days. You are strongly urged to stop smoking at this time, if you plan to apply.

Details on the availability of on-campus housing for students participating in the JCU-CCF summer research program have not been settled. While it is likely that some on-campus housing will be available, it is possible that it might not be available to all participating students and/or that students will be required to pay at least a portion of the cost of housing. In any event, on-campus housing is **not** guaranteed to students participating in the JCU-CCF program.
