Objectives of the Course

This is the first half of a beginning-level college course in which we will cover chapters 1 through 5 of the *¡Viva!* program. The objectives are to teach you how to communicate effectively in Spanish by using all four language skills—listening, speaking, reading, and writing—in everyday situations. During the course of this semester, you will have the opportunity to:

1. Develop an ability to understand authentic spoken Spanish in a variety of culturally appropriate formats—as native speakers of Spanish discuss a range of topics on the *¡Viva!* Audio and video materials.
2. Acquire a basic knowledge of Spanish grammar and practical vocabulary
3. Actively use the language in talking, listening, reading, and writing.
4. Enhance your awareness of Hispanic culture, allowing you to integrate cultural competency into your knowledge of Spanish.

Required Course Materials

1. Donley, Philip Redwine and José A. Blanco. *¡Viva!: Primer curso de lengua española*. 2nd ed. Boston: Vista Higher Learning, 2011. (purchased as an e-book at vhlcentral or hard copy from the bookstore)
2. You also need a Student passcode that allows you to access the *¡Viva!* Student Supersite at <http://viva.vhlcentral.com/>. Via the Supersite and your passcode, you will access the online Student Activities Manual (Workbook/Lab/Video Activities). Viva Supersite will be the main source for this online class. The site gives you many opportunities to practice the vocabulary and grammar presented in class, as well as work on pronunciation, listening, reading, and writing skills.
3. In “Viva Supersite” you can also find several online reference tools like:
 - a. Spanish mini dictionary
 - b. VHL dictionary
 - c. Verb wheel
