Director's Message

Dear Friends of the GSW program,

This fall we find ourselves surrounded by news stories concerning gender—in politics, in social media, and in Hollywood. As the #MeToo campaign went viral in October and victims of sexual harassment and sexual assault shared their stories to raise awareness, more people than before became aware of how ubiquitous these experiences have been in the lives of women close to them. As powerful men, such as Harvey Weinstein—who has been accused before of sexual assault with no consequences—finally appear to be experiencing the negative consequences of their actions, one hopes these are signs of progress on the issues.

According to several reports, more women are entering politics now than at any previous time. Whether this is framed as a backlash or a continuity of forward progress, their opportunities appear to signal that there may be more men and women in the country who no longer see gender as a barrier to public office and leadership positions. As men make the news for sexist reasons, there is a simultaneous increased focus on the role of male feminists and allies. Here at JCU, we've had a Student Union president who has cared about issues of gendered violence and encouraged initiatives on the matter over the past year. In the Student Union, we have also seen increased programing, structural changes, and sub-committee work around issues of diversity more broadly. These changes occurred the same year that John Carroll celebrated the first female President in the history of the institution.

In other words, there are a lot of awful things going on in the world—inequality, poverty, discrimination, mass shootings, domestic violence, sex trafficking and more. While the classes in the GSW major and minor sometimes explore the causes and consequences of these, it is important to also pause and recognize that there is evidence that progress is slowly being made. As we get ready for snow here in Cleveland over the next few weeks, it can be a gloomy time for many people; I hope you are all also noticing around you, reasons to feel hopeful.
